

Thank you for circulating this to our office. Please note that we have not competed a screening of natural heritage or other resource values for the project at this time. This response, however, does provide information to guide you in identifying and assessing natural features and resources as required by applicable policies and legislation, as well as engaging with the ministry for advice as needed as you move into your Class EA process.

Please also note that it is the proponent's responsibility to be aware of, and comply with, all relevant federal or provincial legislation, municipal by-laws or other agency approvals.

Natural Heritage

MNRF's natural heritage and natural resources GIS data layers can be obtained through the ministry's Land Information Ontario (LIO) website. You may also view natural heritage information online (e.g., Provincially Significant Wetlands, ANSI's, woodlands, etc.) using the Make a Map: Natural Heritage Areas tool. Thank you for providing the Ministry of Citizenship and Multiculturalism (MCM) with the Notice for the above-referenced project.

MCM's interest in this project relates to its mandate of conserving Ontario's cultural heritage, which includes:

- archaeological resources, including land and marine);
- built heritage resources, including bridges and monuments; and
- cultural heritage landscapes.

Under the EA process, the proponent is required to determine a project's potential impact on known (previously recognized) and potential cultural heritage resources.

Project Summary

Utilities Kingston is undertaking a study to investigate the feasibility of a combined biosolids and food waste processing facility at Knox Farm, a municipally-owned property located off Perth Road just north of Highway 401 and Division St. in the City of Kingston. This project is in the early stages, and builds on the Master Plan for Enhanced Biosolids Management and Biogas Utilization, project completed in 2020.

The current project will include a more detailed review of the City-owned Knox Farm Property, followed by an official commencement of the Schedule C Class EA process in accordance with the MCEA's Phases 3 ('alternative design concepts') and 4 ('environmental study report'). The Class EA will culminate with the preparation and public posting of an Environmental Study Report.

Identifying Cultural Heritage Resources

While some cultural heritage resources may have already been formally identified, others may be identified through screening and evaluation.

Archaeological Resources





This email serves as a brief notification from Utilities Kingston of a project called the Kingston Regional Biosoilds and Biogas Facility Municipal Class Environmental Assessment. We would like to inform you of an upcoming Public Drop in Session for the proposed Facility to be held on Tuesday, March 28 from 4 to 8 pm. Please find the Notice attached with more information.

You are being contacted as part of our municipal Indigenous consultation process which Utilities Kingston and the City of Kingston undertakes both under their obligations as well as their community interest in strengthening relations with Indigenous communities. After you have reviewed this email please feel free to contact me or our team members listed at the end of this email if you would like to receive more information. If you prefer a hard copy of any project information mailed to you, please let us know so that we can prepare and send it to you.

Utilities Kingston manages the water and wastewater infrastructure for the City of Kingston. As part of those duties, Utilities Kingston undertakes long range planning and studies to provide the community with continuous, safe and reliable services. Utilities Kingston is now in the early stages of this study which will assess the environmental, technical and financial feasibility of developing the City-owned Knox Farm property with a biosolids/biogas facility. The Knox Farm property is 73.42 ha (181.44 ac) in size and is located to the north of Highway 401 in the central area of the municipality as can be seen on the map provided. The specific location of the facility is targeting a 9 ha, previously cleared parcel of the property next to the City's snow dump facility (shown as a red hatched area in the attached map). If approved in the future, such a facility would play a key role in the community's enhanced management of the settled organic solid material from wastewater treatment processes, as well as the City's management of residential green bin organics.

The overall study is in the form of an Environmental Assessment (EA) and includes a number of areas of research. Utilities Kingston has hired Dillon Consulting Limited to lead the EA process which is expected to continue into 2023. As part of the EA study team, Archaeological Research Associates Ltd. will be preparing two assignments: (i) a Stage 1 Archaeological Assessment and (ii) a Cultural Heritage Assessment Report. A Stage 1 Archaeological Assessment land conditions in the area including known archaeological sites.

Recommendations related to further possible archaeological requirements will also be identified through that work. The goal of the Cultural Heritage Assessment Report is to map all cultural heritage resources within the study area which may be affected by the project. Any mitigation measures that the project should adopt to protect those cultural heritage resources will be described along with recommendations, if any, for further studies.

If the Metis Nation of Ontario wishes to participate in a consultation on the archaeological, cultural or any other aspects of the project we would be

This email serves as a brief notification from Utilities Kingston of a project called the Kingston Regional Biosolids and Biogas Facility Municipal Class Environmental Assessment. You are being contacted as part of our municipal Indigenous consultation process which Utilities Kingston and the City of Kingston undertakes both under their obligations as well as their community interest in strengthening relations with Indigenous communities. After you have reviewed this email please feel free to contact me or our team members listed at the end of this email if you would like to receive more information. If you prefer a hard copy of any project information mailed to you, please let us know so that we can prepare and send it to you.

Utilities Kingston manages the water and wastewater infrastructure for the City of Kingston. As part of those duties, Utilities Kingston undertakes long range planning and studies to provide the community with continuous, safe and reliable services. Utilities Kingston is now in the early stages of this study which will assess the environmental, technical and financial feasibility of developing the City-owned Knox Farm property with a biosolids/biogas facility. The Knox Farm property is 73.42 ha (181.44 ac) in size and is located to the north of Highway 401 in the central area of the municipality as can be seen on the map provided. The specific location of the facility is targeting a 9 ha, previously cleared parcel of the property next to the City's snow dump facility (shown as a red hatched area in the attached map). If approved in the future, such a facility would play a key role in the community's enhanced management of the settled organic solid material from wastewater treatment processes, as well as the City's management of residential green bin organics.

The overall study is in the form of an Environmental Assessment (EA) and includes a number of areas of research. Utilities Kingston has hired Dillon Consulting Limited to lead the EA process which is expected to continue into 2023. As part of the EA study team, Archaeological Research Associates Ltd. will be preparing two assignments: (i) a Stage 1 Archaeological Assessment and (ii) a Cultural Heritage Assessment Report. A Stage 1 Archaeological Assessment describes the archaeology, history, geography, and current land conditions in the area including known archaeological sites.

Recommendations related to further possible archaeological requirements will also be identified through that work. The goal of the Cultural Heritage Assessment Report is to map all cultural heritage resources within the study area which may be affected by the project. Any mitigation measures that the project should adopt to protect those cultural heritage resources will be described along with recommendations, if any, for further studies.







Re: Potential impact related to the proposed Biosolids and Biogas Facility at Knox Farm

We are the lawyers for the Holiday Inn Express & Suites, the Quality Inn and the Comfort Suites located on Benson Street in Kingston. Our client also owns other lands along the Highway 401 corridor at Division Street and Sir John A. MacDonald Boulevards. This letter is to raise our client's opposition to the construction of the proposed Biosolids and Biogas Facility (the "Proposed Facility") at the Knox Farm location.

Knox Farms as a possible location for the Proposed Facility raises a number of concerns. We ask that the approval of the Knox Farm site be rejected for the following reasons, or at least withheld until such time as the below concerns are addressed and it is confirmed that the Proposed Facility will not have any impact particularly in regard to odour.

Impact to Surrounding Businesses

If the Proposed Facility was constructed at Knox Farm, the 401 Highway would be the only physical structure separating the Proposed Facility and dozens of businesses. As you may know, the area on the south side of the highway contains our client's hotels, the King's Crossing Fashion Outlet, the most popular movie theatre in Kingston, a grocery store, an LCBO, a Canadian Tire, the Kingslake Plaza, and dozens of restaurants. Our client also owns other land along this corridor both north and south of the highway.

Office	Office

If the construction and then operation of the Proposed Facility at the Knox Farm location creates obnoxious odours, noise, or impacts air quality, dozens of businesses will suffer as a result. This could result in nuisance claims being launched against the City of Kingston and Utilities Kingston.

Impact to Tourism and Reputation

The aforementioned area south of the 401 Highway is also a major stop along the 401 Highway. Many people 'visit' Kingston momentarily while they refuel and purchase food. The two main bus companies, Megabus and Rider Express, onload and offload their passengers for travel in this area.

For many people in Ontario, this area may be their only impression of Kingston. If the operation of the Proposed Facility creates obnoxious odours, noise or impacts the air quality in that area, the reputation of Kingston could be impacted. Those who momentarily visit Kingston by stopping in this area would likely have a lower opinion of the city, which may impact tourism.

Nearby Conservation Area

The Knox Farm location is situated directly next to the Cataraqui Creek Conservation Area. This conservation area is a sensitive natural heritage site and contains species-at-risk habitat. The construction of a brand new Biosolids and Biogas facility next to the conservation area has a potential to put the area at risk.

Moreover, the construction of the Proposed Facility at the Knox Farm location may pose a risk to groundwater. The Knox Farm location is within the Cataraqui Source Protection Area and is identified as a highly vulnerable area. The site is within a Groundwater Recharge Area that refills aquifers in the area, which provides drinking water for local residents and is critical to maintain.

Proximity in the Event of an Accident

As mentioned, the area is comprised of dozens of businesses and a natural heritage site. Moreover, the area is near critical infrastructure such as the 401 highway and bus stations. This context is significant because if there was an accident at the Proposed Facility, the impact would be substantial.

As you may know, similar Biogas and Biosolids facilities have been constructed internationally. Similar facilities in Korea, the United Kingdom and the United States of America have suffered from tragic accidents due to the nature of the facility. For example, Biogas is incredibly flammable and has resulted in explosions when ignited. In addition, the sludge used for processing at the Proposed Facility has been problematic in similar facilities. In the United Kingdom, there was an overflow of sludge at a Biosolids and Biogas facility that caused significant contamination to the surrounding 70 acres of land.

It is also significant that the transport of sludge and other contaminants would need to be by truck, as the Knox Farm location does not contain the necessary infrastructure to transport the material otherwise, exacerbating the likelihood of an accident at the facility. If a similar accident to those reported internationally was to take place at the Proposed Facility, at the Knox Farm location, the results would be devastating to our aquifer systems, the Cataraqui Creek Conservation Area, critical infrastructure, and dozens of businesses.

In view of the foregoing, we kindly ask that you give appropriate weight to the concerns articulated above, and do not proceed with the approval and construction of the Proposed Facility at the Knox Farm location unless these concerns can be fully and adequately addressed. Proceeding otherwise would have a devastating and long-term impact on the community and the surrounding environment.
